WHY IS IT CALLED A TATTOO?
In 17th Century Holland, for campaigning troops the social centres were
the ins and taverns. A method used to induce the soldiers to return to their billets was to have
the innkeepers turn off the beer taps. This was accomplished by having a drummer march
through the streets between 9:30 and 10:00 p.m. beating a warning call. The old Dutch expression
for this call was "doe den tap toe" which meant "shut off the taps." Shortened to "Taptoe" it
gradually evolved through usage to "Tattoo". As time passed other musicians joined the drummer and eventually complete bands were playing concerts for the entertainment of the garrisnen.
Later on Tattoos were performed for royalty and the general public.
